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Forty students, representing five countries, made up the class of 2023. 100% of the KAS (Karachi American School) graduates were admitted into one or more higher education destinations of their choice.

KARACHI AMERICAN SCHOOL (FOUNDED IN 1953)

Karachi American School (KAS) is a selective co-educational day school, which offers an American curriculum English language instructional program from Pre-K through Grade 12. Karachi American School does not discriminate based on race, color, gender, national or ethnic origin in administering its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship, loan policies, athletic and other school administered programs. Founded to serve American and other expatriate children, Karachi American School has developed into a diverse learning institution, serving host nationals and expatriates following an American College Preparatory AP curriculum. KAS grants merit scholarships to deserving local students. The school is housed in a purpose-built plant on approximately twelve acres of land. Included are elementary and secondary buildings, libraries, art studios, science and computer laboratories, a gymnasium, squash, and tennis courts, playing fields, swimming pool, cafeteria, and an auditorium.

FACULTY

There are 55 full-time faculty members, including 14 U.S. citizens, 38 host country nationals, and 3 persons of other nationalities. All overseas hires are certified and hold degrees from U.S. universities, with most of the faculty holding fifth year or postgraduate degrees. KAS actively and financially supports teacher training and continuing education for its staff.

CALENDAR

A two-semester system is employed at KAS: the first semester is from August to December; the second semester is from January through May.

ACTIVITIES

Extra-curricular activities are a part of each student's and teacher's commitment to Karachi American School and KAS had over 75 different clubs, sports, and community service opportunities. Athletics, field trips, music organizations, cultural programs, student government, drama productions, Model United Nations, and numerous other clubs provide community engagement for students, parents, and teachers. KAS has chapters of the National Honor Society, National Junior Honor Society, and the French, Spanish and Music Honor Societies. Through its membership in the South Asia Inter-School Association (SAISA), KAS offers students, in middle and high school, opportunities to interact with students at other international schools in varsity athletics, academic, music, and cultural exchanges several times a year. KAS sent students to 7 international competitions for the first time since 2019-2020.

COVID AND OTHER DISRUPTIONS

On February 27th, 2020, the government of Sindh, Pakistan closed all schools due to COVID19. KAS went remote for the remainder of the school year with a shortened daily schedule, 40-minute classes and our usual Friday half day to respect Pakistan's religious traditions. All extracurriculars were canceled. No change was made to the grading scale and community service was eliminated from the graduation requirements.

KAS remained remote for 2020-21 for the entire year. For the Class of 2023, their entire Sophomore year was remote with negative impacts. Course and program offerings were more limited than 2019-2020 due to staffing shortages and declining enrollment.

2021-2022 KAS returned in-person with rigorous COVID protocols such as mask and vaccine mandates. There were only 3 extracurriculars phased in during the Fall as vaccine benchmarks were met. The 3rd quarter KAS again went remote due to OMICRON. The 4th quarter was again in-person with a few more extracurriculars.

Academic year 2022-2023 was delayed by two weeks due to historic flooding in Pakistan which made worldwide news. KAS eventually managed to return to in-person instruction, offering a full program, back to pre-COVID standards across all divisions with 55-minute class periods and a full-length day with a full program for the first time since February 2020.

2022-2023 saw an additional loss of instructional time due to frequent political instability throughout the year, forcing the school to close and recommend community lock downs.



GRADING SYSTEM

G.P.A.s are calculated using a 4.0 scaling system.

G.P.A.s are weighted by calculating a multiple of 1.2 quality points for grades in Advanced Placement (AP) courses and 1.0 for non-AP courses. KAS has no other honor or advanced courses.

*Up until 2021-2022, AP courses were limited to Juniors and Seniors. As of 2022-2023 Sophomores had access to one AP class - Computer Science Principles. AP Seminar has been added for Sophomores as of 2023-2024.

CURRICULUM

Courses at Karachi American School are college preparatory level courses. For the Class of 2023, students must have completed 26.0 credits for graduation. World History 1 was replaced with Pakistan Studies in 2021-2022. Speech & Writing was eliminated as a graduation requirement as of 2023-2024 to allow students more choice including AP courses in Sophomore year. (Note: One credit is given for one year of successful study in any subject, which meets 220 minutes per week.) Minimum requirements are:

COURSE OFFERINGS

ADMISSION

Admission to Karachi American School is highly selective and competitive. Qualified students capable of completing a demanding college preparatory program with a strong AP program are admitted. Admission is based on prior academic record, standardized test scores, three letters of recommendation, graded writing sample, and an admission interview for parent and applicant. The school makes a conscious effort to preserve size, ethnicity, and gender for each grade level. KAS favors open enrollment with counseling for AP courses and the AP International Diploma is offered.

ENROLLMENT SECTION

Currently there are 319 students in K3 through grade 12 representing 9 nationalities: 56 U.S. citizens, 202 Pakistanis and 61 from other countries. In the high school, there are 145 students: 38 seniors, 35 juniors, 39 sophomores and 33 first-year students. The student-teacher ratio is 6:1.

ACCREDITATION

The school has been fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and secondary schools since 1962 through 2024.

CLASS RANK

Because of the small size and strong quality of our graduating classes, we do not rank our students. Historically, our strength is such that all our students have a solid academic foundation and have performed well at competitive colleges.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

The Advanced Placement (AP) program plays an integral part in the curriculum of Karachi American School and was restricted to 11th and 12th grades until 2022-2023 when KAS Sophomores were allowed access to limited AP courses.

KAS favors open enrollment to AP courses but those with AP recommended pre-requisites can be based on past academic achievement, including a minimum grade of B in all prerequisite courses and teacher recommendations.

In May 2023, 97 students took 318 exams with twenty percent scoring four or higher, and about twenty-five percent scoring three or higher.

The academic environment at Karachi American School is demanding, rigorous and competitive. All courses are taught at a college preparatory level. As a part of its academic policy, Karachi American School does not offer SAT preparation courses on campus, nor do we recommend or encourage enrolling in these classes. We believe that students are more than a number and encourage them to explore their interests through coursework, extracurriculars and working with outside community service organizations and mentors to develop their personal interests.

*Though College Counseling appears on students' transcripts as a class, there is no period or block (seat time) during the school day. It is the only way our LMS can allow for counseling of upper-class students by sharing resources and is a communication tool only. All group and one-to-one counseling are done outside of school hours by one part-time college counselor.
