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Thirty-seven students, representing five countries, made up the class of 2024. 100% of the KAS (Karachi American School) graduates were admitted into one or more higher education destinations of their choice.

KARACHI AMERICAN SCHOOL (FOUNDED IN 1953)

Karachi American School (KAS) is a selective co-educational day school, which offers an American curriculum English language instructional program from Pre-K through Grade 12. Karachi American School does not discriminate based on race, color, gender, national or ethnic origin in administering its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship, loan policies, athletic, and other school administered programs. Founded to serve American and other expatriate children, Karachi American School has developed into a diverse learning institution, serving host nationals and expatriates following an American College Preparatory AP curriculum. KAS grants merit scholarships to deserving local students. The school is housed in a purpose-built plant on approximately twelve acres of land.

FACULTY

There are 67 full-time faculty members, including 13 U.S. citizens, 49 host country nationals, and 5 persons of other nationalities (Australia, Canada, & Kenya,). All overseas hires are certified and hold degrees from U.S. universities, with most of the faculty holding fifth year or postgraduate degrees. KAS actively and financially supports teacher training and continuing education for its staff.

CALENDAR

A two-semester system is employed at KAS: the first semester is from August to December; the second semester is from January through May.

ACTIVITIES

Extra-curricular activities are a part of each student's and teacher's commitment to Karachi American School and KAS has over 75 different clubs, sports, and community service opportunities. KAS has chapters of the National Honor Society, National Junior Honor Society, and the French, Spanish and Music Honor Societies. Through its membership in the South Asia Inter-School Association (SAISA), KAS offers students, in middle and high school, opportunities to interact with students at other international schools in varsity athletics, academic, music, and cultural exchanges several times a year. KAS sent students to 7 international competitions for the first time since 2019-2020.

COVID AND OTHER DISRUPTIONS IMPACTING THE CLASS OF 2024

In February of 2020, the government of Sindh, Pakistan closed all schools due to COVID19. KAS went remote for the remainder of the school year with a shortened daily schedule, 40-minute classes and our usual Friday half day to respect Pakistan's religious traditions. All extracurriculars were canceled. No change was made to the grading scale and community service was eliminated from the graduation requirements.

KAS remained remote for 2020-21. For the Class of 2024, their entire Freshmen year was remote. Course and program offerings were limited due to staffing shortages and declining enrollment.

In 2021-2022 we returned in-person with rigorous COVID protocols. 3 extracurriculars were phased in during the Fall as vaccine benchmarks were met. The 3rd quarter KAS again went remote due to OMICRON. The 4th quarter was again in-person.

2022-2023 was delayed by two weeks due to historic flooding in Pakistan. Eventually we returned to in-person instruction, offering a full program, back to pre-COVID standards across all divisions with 55-minute class periods and a full-length day for the first time since February 2020. 2022-2023 saw an additional loss of instructional time throughout the year due to frequent political and civil unrest forcing the school to close, including 3 days during AP exams.

2023-2024 was the most stable since pre-COVID and one week of instructional time was lost as the government ordered schools to close nationwide due to political instability during the elections of February 2024.

GRADING SYSTEM

G.P.A.s are calculated using a 4.0 scaling system. G.P.A.s are weighted by calculating a multiple of 1.2 quality points for grades in Advanced Placement (AP) courses and 1.0 for non-AP courses. KAS has no other honor or advanced courses.

*Up until 2021-2022, AP courses were limited to Juniors and Seniors.

ADMISSION

Admission to Karachi American School is highly selective and competitive. Qualified students capable of completing a college preparatory program are admitted. Admission is based on prior academic record, standardized test scores, three letters of recommendation, graded writing sample, and an admission interview for parent and applicant. The school makes a conscious effort to preserve size, ethnicity, and gender for each grade level. KAS favors open enrollment with counseling for AP courses and the AP International Diploma is offered.

ENROLLMENT SECTION

Currently there are 302 students in K3 through grade 12 representing 10 nationalities: 52 U.S. citizens, 183 Pakistanis and 71 from other countries. In the high school, there are 147 students: 34 seniors, 42 juniors, 36 sophomores and 35 first-year students. The student-teacher ratio is 6:1.

ACCREDITATION

The school has been fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and secondary schools since 1962 through 2025 and is going through the accreditation process this year.

CLASS RANK

Because of the small size and strong quality of our graduating classes, we do not rank our students.

CURRICULUM

Courses at Karachi American School are college preparatory level courses. For the Class of 2024, students must have completed 25.0 credits for graduation. World History 1 was replaced with Pakistan Studies in 2021-2022. Speech & Writing was eliminated as a graduation requirement as of 2023-2024 to allow students more choice including AP courses in Sophomore year. (Note: One credit is given for one year of successful study in any subject, which meets 220 minutes per week.) Minimum requirements are:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

The Advanced Placement (AP) program plays an integral part in the curriculum of Karachi American School and was restricted to 11th and 12th grades until 2022-2023 when Sophomores were allowed access to AP CSP. KAS favors open enrollment to AP courses but we follow AP recommended pre-requisites. KAS does not limit the number of AP courses for juniors and seniors, but students are counseled. In May 2024, 105 students took 268 exams with twenty-five percent scoring four or higher, and about twenty-five percent scoring three or higher.
